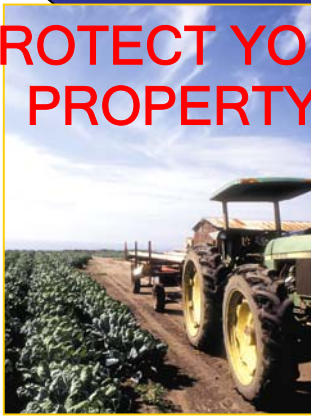

-Why mark equipment?

**-Where should
I mark my
equipment?**

**Thieves
are hesitant
to take items
that can be readily
IDENTIFIED!**

**Place signs, decals, and other
visible information** warning
potential thieves that this equipment
has been marked and registered
with local law enforcement
officials.

**Buy stamping equipment at
Grainger.com! Farm Bureau

Uniformity is key when marking equipment.
Locate the mark on the right side of the
equipment as you are standing behind it.

Equipment with non-removable tongues-
manure spreaders, grain drills, auger wagons,
etc.-place ID number on right side on top of
tongue, 12" to rear of hitch pin. On 3-point
equipment with tool bar, place ID number on top
of tool bar adjacent to right hitch pin.

Mark your equipment in another location
known only to you. If ID numbers are removed
or destroyed, property can still be positively
identified.
